I hope everyone had a safe and enjoyable winter. I'm sure many of you are like me and have had enough of the cold wet weather and looking forward to spring.





### **ASSE Standard 1060 Heater Requirements for Class I BFP Enclosures**

All American Society of Sanitary Engineering (ASSE) standards are opened for review and input every five years in order to incorporate the best practices in the industry. In 2006, a working group of engineers and other industry professionals revised ASSE Standard 1060, Outdoor Enclosures for Fluid Conveying Components, which pertains to freeze and vandal protective enclosures for backflow prevention assemblies and other fluid conveying components. ASSE gives the companies holding certification three years to comply with all revisions to the standard.

ASSE Standard 1060 recognizes three classes of enclosures. Class I is a heated and insulated enclosure (R-8 minimum insulation) that is designed for freezing temperatures. Class II is an enclosure that has insulation without heat. No guarantees are made about the ability to protect against freezing with this enclosure. The Class II definition reads, "These enclosures shall be designed and constructed to be installed in minimum external temperatures of  $33^{\circ}F$  (0.6°C)." Class III enclosures are designed for security only, without any insulation or heat.

Several upgrades were made to the ASSE Standard 1060 in 2006. One of the 2006 changes was made to section 1.2.3, titled Heat Sources (Class I & I-V), which was revised to read, "Electric heat sources and electrical components which are associated with the heat source and supplied by the manufacturer shall be listed by an independent product safety listing and certification agency for use in damp locations". The inside of an enclosure that houses a backflow prevention assembly is a "damp" location.

This "damp" designation is a logical conclusion since the reduced pressure (RP) principle backflow preventers are designed to discharge water whenever a pressure differential in the water line is detected. Any RP assembly discharge will cause water spray inside the enclosure. The revised ASSE Standard 1060 in 2006 properly concluded that all heaters used for Class I freeze protection; need to be able to operate safely in the damp environment typically found inside the enclosure. It is a safety and performance reliability issue.

So what is the practical result of the 2006 revised ASSE 1060 standard? All Class I enclosures must have a heat source that has been independently certified for use under damp conditions AND that enclosure design type must have passed the -30 F freeze protection test at the ASSE approved lab with the 'damp' certified heat source inside. Most BFPs 2" and smaller are protected from freezing with heat cables. Many standard heat cables are suitable for use in 'damp" conditions. The heat source provided for most 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " and above sized BFPs are heaters mounted within the enclosure. In the past, enclosure manufacturers used heaters that were not designed for safe & reliable operation in damp conditions.

Contact ASSE in Westlake, Ohio (440-835-3040), your enclosure manufacturer or the manufacturer's rep if you have any questions about heater certification or to request a listing of 'damp' certified heat sources offered and a copy of the independent certification. There are several models of heaters available that meet the "damp" location requirement.

Water system managers and design professionals require backflow assemblies that are listed by independent certification organizations and most maintain a list of approved assemblies. Those that maintain best practice principals should require protective enclosures and heaters certified by ASSE to standard 1060 Class I and maintain a list of approved manufacturers provided by ASSE that adhere to the 2006 revisions for heat sources.
