

STANDARD TEST PROCEDURES NEEDED

There has been a lot of talk about the test procedures for backflow prevention devices. There are different procedures from different places, for example: ASSE, AWWA or USC. Which one of these are we supposed to use here in the state of Tennessee? If we look in the rules and regulations we find that there are no guidelines for a standard procedure, but actually we do have standard test procedures to go by. The test procedures, which everyone within the state of Tennessee that test backflow devices uses and understands, are the ones used at Fleming Training Center in Murfreesboro. These test procedures are used during the training of persons getting their license to test backflow devices within the state. They are also used to insure that licensed individuals know and understand how to test a backflow device and to provide continuity within the program.

Each and every water purveyor in the state of Tennessee should be using the test procedures used by the Fleming Training Center. We should not only be using the Training Center procedures but also the information they provide on the Testing Results Sheet. Here are some examples of things that should be on your Test Results Sheet:

- 1. It should indicate if the test is for a new inspection, annual inspection or a re-inspection.
- 2. It should have a place for all backflow device information: size, Model No., Serial No., manufacturer, location of the device, and type of device.
- 3. Test results properly recorded: opening of a relief valve, back pressure tests for the # 2 check valve, the shut off valve and the # 2 check in the direction of flow.

All this information and more should be gathered and recorded for your files.

We at TBPA along with the great state of Tennessee inspectors want to have continuity within the cross connection control program. One of the ways that we can accomplish this is to have our test procedures and paperwork the same. We should all be following the guidelines used by Fleming Training Center for the testing of backflow prevention devices and recording that information. We need to look at all our paperwork to insure that the way we do business is the same as that of the state.





Message from ABPA


