Lowe added, "Isaac Bourne is an outstanding student and deserves recognition."


Isaac is the son of Mark and Patty Bourne of Adams, TN and will be attending Freed-Hardeman University in Henderson, TN this fall as a freshman.

TBPA West Section News Speak Up! Commentary

DW &RP Article – dated November 2008

This issue let's finish up by looking at Installation.

Manufacturers' installation instructions require that

devices that have the potential to discharge water, not be installed where they can cause damage to the structure, this is a disclaimer and if the system is not properly installed the owner's insurance will not cover the damage, so be very careful what you recommend.

Should the RP be installed higher than 60 inches above finished floor, OSHA regulations come into play and OSHA requires that a permanent platform with a guard rail and ladder shall be provided.

The DCV devices, (ASSE 1015 & 1048), are recommended for installation on fire sprinkler systems, the reason being, fire sprinkler systems are static emergency systems, usually installed entirely within the structure with remotely operated valves extending to the out-of-doors. The system is for emergency use only with specific requirements for thermal expansion control. Since the system is static it becomes stagnant to the point that the water no longer react with the material composition of the pipe, but has no effect on the waters' ability to suppress a fire. Conversely if an RP is installed it will continually react to fluctuations in water main pressure, continuously causing the #1 check to admit water into the "zone", the #1 check will not open fully and will act as a strainer, trapping debris between the disk and seat causing the #1 check to fail prematurely, (remember strainers are not used on fire sprinkler systems). Also because the RP had a drain/vent, properly engineered drainage must be provided.

On the outlet side of the cross-connection control device a union of flange should be installed to facilitate removal without cutting into the plumbing system. Note: Providing all fittings are flanged type, no unions would be required, however threaded, glued or crimped joints require unions to facilitate repair and/or replacement.

Lastly, a full port outlet isolation valve should be installed to prevent the premises plumbing system from draining back to the work site.

The installation as described is the least expensive installation over the long haul. It provides for a safe work place for the people who must service the equipment. It precludes damage to the structure in the event of system failure. It provides security from tampering with the system, including water theft and theft of the components for scrap. Precludes the deed for "winterization", enclosures can be fitted with heating elements. It protects the system from the inadvertent contamination from chemicals used in the maintenance of the property. As an afterthought, provides a location for a name and address

Some self-predicating irrigation system people recommend removal of the back-flow devices for winterization. We must remember that they are breaking into a permitted and tested plumbing system, then hauling the devices off to who knows where then reinstalling them in the spring. Is this legal? I don't think so!

Come on people wake up and do your job, install and maintain your system correctly, in accordance with established standards, using approved material. You're not saving the customer anything if he/she has to replace damaged or pilfered equipment, or have your ugly mug starring them in the face with your hand out twice a year.

One thing ALL devices, appurtenances, appliances and apparatus intended to serve some special function, such as sterilization, distillation, processing, cooling, or storage of ice or foods, and that connect to the water supply system, require maintenance once a year, that includes testing if required, testing is not the end-all to your work. Cross-connection control people, sprinkler people, and whomever, that does any special work, let the plumbing professionals do their job and you can connect to the system without the worry of doing something wrong or worse getting someone killed.
