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East Tennessee News

Hello everyone, I hate that I did not attend this year conference, but October is by far the busiest month of the year for me but was told it was another good conference with good attendance and good speakers.

I hope everybody has had a great fall and getting ready for another winter season.

Speaking of winter, it has been a warm fall here in East Tn. I was still winterizing irrigation systems this year into the 3rd week of November. As everyone remembers this past winter was very cold and I have seen a few more than normal freezing of the backflow assemblies that I have tested and seen a lot of the shutoff valves and test cocks that have cracked. I have had my knees and shins wet more than normal when I have shut the #2 shutoff valves to do the test. I have to tell some homeowners that water was trapped in the ball valves over the winter, and some has told me they were on unions and were took off and stored in the garage over the winter. I know they are different ways people winterize their systems, some just have drain valve in different areas in the yard and some blow air through the system and if possible blowing the air after the backflow assembly or if blowing air through the assembly have very low air pressure going into the assembly to keep the plastic parts or springs from breaking and I have seen a lot of both of those in my years of testing but I think one of the biggest problems is some leave the shutoff valves either all the way on or all the way off and same with test cocks and that traps enough water between the valves to possibly to expand and the crack the side of the valves or test cocks so I always turn all of them at a 45 degree angle so it does not trap the water. This will be my last newsletter since I am stepping down as the East Tn. Director of 21 years. I remember Larry Stinett was working on a backflow at our water plant and asked me if I would run for that position and I never thought I would still be doing it but I would not trade any of that time for anything. I remember my first conference was at the Downtown Hilton in Nashville and I thought what have I got myself into and I will never forget this but I was standing in line to get my room and Dave Birkholtz in line in front of me maybe 10 people between us and he kept turning around and looking at me and finally he walked back to me and talked to me a minute and he looked down and I had two Stratos boat duffel bags and he said look at you standing in the Nashville Hilton with those two duffel bags and walked back up front in line and man I felt out of place then for sure and when he got his key for the room and he walked past me he had two Loudon Redskin duffel bags and he just smiled and I could have killed him.

I have made many friends with the members, sales reps and vendors from and learned a lot from many different people with the TBPA. I have enjoyed my time serving as the East Tn. Director and Thank you for your trust over the years in me.

I hope some of my newsletters over the years has help you at one point and time and I will still be around if I can help anyone with anything. As I write this, I thought I have been on the TBPA board for a 3rd of my life so now I know I am old, and I need to go take a nap now.

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West Tennessee News

Ok folks, the chill of Fall air is finally upon us. I know that some don't need a reminder but the time to winterize those irrigation systems is also here as well. The past couple of years here in West Tennessee we have experienced some early cold temps that have caught some homeowners and irrigation contractors off guard. The lack of improper winterization of an irrigation system can be very costly. There are many sources available for tips on proper winterization but I'm sure the details of how extensive the process needs to be will vary from region to region. One thing that I always try to convey to a customer that has experienced freeze damage to their backflow preventer is to take every precaution necessary. Too often a system is found that has been "winterized" but the backflow device device is left in-line and exposed to the elements of Mother Nature. This is a gamble.

Sure, piping and the device have been blown out and the water supply has been shut off but there is potential for water to be trapped inside the assembly. An extra measure of protecting that Expensive assembly is to remove it and place it in a warm dry place. Many backflow assemblies are being installed with unions. allowing ease of removal for just this purpose, and still some owners fail or opt not to do so resulting in costly repairs and even entire replacement.

As we too often hear in the industry, "Education is the key." So, from my experiences I offer you my 2-cents. Please let your board members know if there is an area of interest with which you need assistance or would like more information so that we may better serve you.
